You likely saw the news earlier this year when the cellular phone service providers were “sundowning” their older 3G networks to reallocate the equipment and bandwidth to the newer, faster LTE/5G technology. The shutdown of the older cellular networks affected millions of cellular devices that still used the older technology. That garnered significant media attention.

The same thing is happening with traditional phone lines, also known as POTS (Plain Old Telephone Service) landlines. Traditional analog telephone service has been eclipsed by newer, faster, VOIP (Voice-Over-I.P.) internet-based technologies. Despite a dramatic shift by consumers toward cellular and internet communications, there are still millions of homes, businesses, and alarm systems utilizing traditional phone lines to communicate.

NEWSFLASH! Those phone lines are going away, just like dinosaurs and covered wagons! The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has issued a ruling stating phone companies no longer have to provide regulated POTS phone services after August of this year. Those customers using traditional phone technology will need to update their phone services and alarm systems in the near future to prevent an interruption in service.

Once the August sundown date arrives, POTS phone lines will officially become a non-regulated service, allowing the phone carriers to raise prices as they wish and/or discontinue the services completely. It is expected that the phone companies will quickly begin decommissioning their older analog equipment and network lines so they can install new digital equipment instead.
